

WHAT IS INDIGENOUS PEACEKEEPING?

Indigenous peacekeeping is a form of governance that works in partnership with the RCMP, but is designed to reflect local culture and create a sense of safer First Nations communities. Accredited Indigenous Peacekeeping training originated in 2009 when the SK Chiefs directed the FSIN to negotiate training opportunities for Indigenous Peacekeeping services.

PATROL SERVICES

Peacekeeper's services include running patrol at the following locations; Band Office, Health Centre, Payepot school, Day care, Band Hall, Heavy Equipment Building (Green Building), Water Treatment Plant and Old Daycare.



SURVEILLANCE

Piapot has video surveillance at the Band Office, Daycare, Band Hall, School, and Water Treatment Plant. A surveillance monitor post is set up in the Security Office.

WHEN TO CALL THE PEACEKEEPERS?



- To assist with stray animals
- To assist in community and family crises
- To control crowd activity
- To secure investigation scenes
- To liaison with the RCMP

Note - Peacekeepers do not carry weapons and they will not make arrests.



HOURS OF OPERATION

Piapot security work nightly 7 days a week. The security office is located at the old Daycare.
